The Convention

-is the first International document on the Rights of the Child
-spells out the basic human rights of children
- includes 54 articles
-was approved by the UN on the 20th November of 1989
-was ratified by Russia in 1990



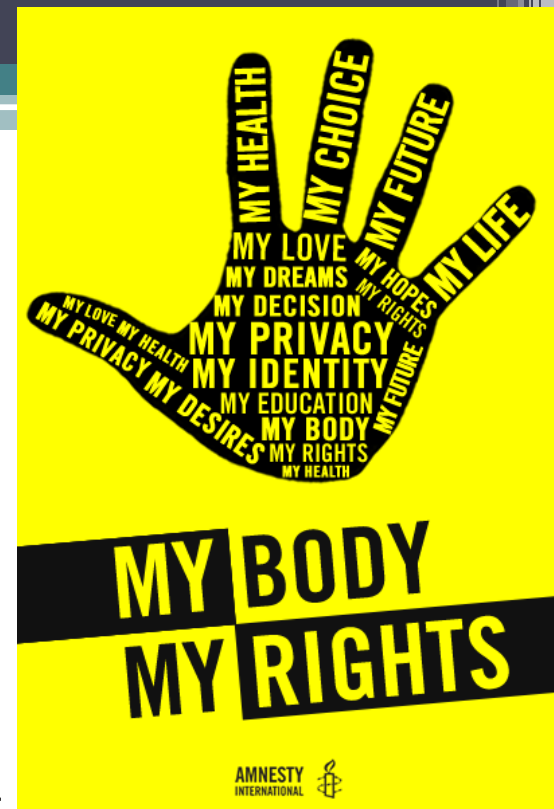
Every child or young person has the right:
